

PROPER USE OF VAGINAL SUPPOSITORIES

Procedure

- Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water before and after using this medication.
- Remove the wrapper from the suppository.
- Place the suppository quickly into warm water just to moisten it.
- If an applicator is used, place the small end of the suppository into the applicator.
- Lie on your back, raise knees and gently insert the applicator into the vagina as far as it will comfortably go.
- Press the plunger gently to release the suppository into the vagina.
- While the plunger is depressed remove the applicator from the vaginal canal.

-OR-

- Lie on your back, raise knees and gently insert the suppository with your finger and push into the vagina as far as it will comfortably go.

Special instructions

- To avoid contamination: after each use, wash applicator and hands thoroughly with soap and water.
- If needed, it is recommended that you use a sanitary napkin rather than a tampon to prevent staining of clothing and bed linens.
- Check with your physician about refraining from sexual intercourse.
- Your doctor should be called if your condition becomes worse or if you experience any vaginal discomfort (such as burning or irritation) from your medication.
- Use the medication as prescribed until it is used up.
- Use continuously, even through menstrual period.
